CERTIFICATE OF INSURANCE (COI) INFORMATION

To participate in SARL races, pilots must provide a Certificate of Insurance (COI) naming SARL as an additional insured entity. Here is an example of the requested addition to your insurance policy:

ADDITIONAL INSURED

In consideration of the payment of the premium for this policy, it is agreed that:

1. ADDITIONAL INSURED

As respects Liability Coverage D – Single Limit Bodily Injury and Property Damage Liability, the definition of **Insured** includes the person(s) or organization(s) described in Paragraph 3 below, but only with respect to his, her, or its liability because of acts or omissions of the **Named Insured**.

2. COVERAGE EXCLUSION

Unless otherwise indicated in this policy, the policy shall not apply to any assumption of the liability of the person(s) or organization(s) described in Paragraph 3 below by the **Named Insured** for **bodily injury** or **property damage** cause by an **occurrence** arising out of any service performed by or on behalf of such person(s) or organization(s).

Because some insurance agents may be concerned about the term "racing", we suggest you provide the following information:

The Sport Air Racing League is a group of pilots who fly timed cross-country rallies hosted by members. Our history of competing since 2007 without any incidents is based on several factors including:

 Rallies are flights typically taking off and landing from one airport and having 5-7 turns. They are designed to be completed in an hour or less

- 2. Flying is only done in VFR conditions and all FARs must be adhered to
- 3. Pilots can only participate if they attend a mandatory safety briefing
- 4. Starts are staggered every 20-40 seconds from the fastest plane to the slowest so planes rarely pass
- 5. The number of participants is generally under 20 planes
- 6. Any pilot performing an unsafe maneuver is disqualified.

This league focuses on fun and safety. We want to improve pilots' skills, not attempt to "win" the rally at any cost.
